Ohio Parent to Parent Statewide Mentoring & Support Program

We have recently begun implementing the P2P USA model in Ohio. The first step in this peer matching program is to recruit and train parents who are interested in providing support to other parents seeking support. Once we have enough Support Parents, we will open up the program to those parents seeking support.

One Support Parent said that through this training he learned that his experiences could help someone else more than he realized.

Ohio F2F continues to partner with a research team at Nationwide Children's Hospital to collect family input/feedback on an exciting new technology being developed. The Speak Health project is hoping to create an app that families can use with a voice-activated speaker (like Alexa or Echo) for documenting caregiving tasks for their child(ren) with complex healthcare needs. Families were given an opportunity to complete surveys in a recent phase of the project. The research team will present and demonstrate a prototype of the technology at the Maternal and Child Health Bureau in Washington, DC next week! We are hoping they will get approved for a second round of funding. Stay tuned for a report of family survey results and a timeline for this project to continue.
